LIGHT UP A LIFE

AN ESSENTIAL PIECE OF EQUIPMENT

y name is Devon Weller and I'm a Registered Nurse at Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH). I work as a medical float, meaning I work in different departments throughout NHH, going where I'm needed to provide care for patients. I'm honoured to be chairing this year's Light Up a Life campaign.

Working in a variety of departments, I see and use many different pieces of equipment each day, but one item used in all departments of our hospital is the bed. Our beds have to be one of our most essential pieces of equipment, in use 365 days a year. Last year alone, we had more than 4,400 admissions. Every one of these admitted in-patients – from new moms to seniors, the seriously injured to the critically ill – relies on the comfort and safety of a specialized bed during their stay at NHH.

With electronic features and functions to ensure both patient and staff safety, our hospital beds are so much more than a standard bed. These beds have easy to use



controls and are fully adjustable; can be lowered and raised to prevent injuries from patients falling out of bed; have in-bed weigh scales to monitor patients' weight; include built-in bed alarms to ensure patient safety; are compatible with specialty mattresses that prevent pressure injuries from developing; and so much more. These are not simply spaces for patients to rest their heads, but are fully functioning pieces of equipment, instrumental to providing exceptional patient care.


Before starting at NHH, I worked at a larger hospital in Northern Ontario. It was immediately clear when I moved here that NHH is special – the size and connectedness of our community hospital allows the team to get to know one another, to bond, and develop a family-like dynamic. Our NHH family is here for you and for our community.

Our primary goal through this year's Light Up a Life Campaign is to purchase 17 new electric beds.

Now in its 26th year, this annual campaign has raised over \$2.6 million for hospital equipment.

If you or a loved one has ever been admitted to NHH, you know how integral our beds are – these are what you're tucked into at the end of the day, are what you gather around to hold the hand of a loved one, and are what support us through every moment. They are central to the patient experience.

GRATEFUL PATIENT

KATELYN TAYLOR

atelyn Taylor is a daughter, a sister, a mother, a wife, a teacher, an author, and an athlete. Katelyn also suffers from a mental illness.

When Katelyn had her first positive sign of psychosis - thinking she saw a dead man on the side of the road while driving - she convinced herself she was just sleep deprived and her eyes were playing tricks on her. As a new mom, being tired wasn't unusual, but it soon became clear something more was going on.

Katelyn and her husband, Chadd, had been through fertility treatments to have their son, Jackson - driving every other day from their Trent Hills home to Scarborough. Soon after his birth, something in her changed: she wouldn't speak unless spoken to, she avoided eye contact, and she felt no emotional attachment towards the son she had worked so hard to have.

"You'd think because I worked so hard to have a baby, I wouldn't have issues, but unfortunately it doesn't work like that," says Katelyn.

Initially, a friend suspected Katelyn had postpartum depression and had planned an intervention, but these feelings and symptoms went beyond this. Shortly after the driving incident, Katelyn began hearing male voices: at first taunting her, laughing sinisterly, and providing a running commentary on her life; eventually, one telling her she should kill herself.

"I was afraid to tell people how bad it was because I thought I would be locked up in an institution," remembers Katelyn. "So, I kept it to myself, but my family around me were concerned."

One of the first to notice something was going on, Katelyn's identical twin sister, Allyson, hopped in her car and drove three hours after a phone call with Katelyn had her worried. On Mother's Day in 2014, her family sat her down and shared their concern and she admitted everything: the hallucinations, the apathy, the depression. Allyson took Jackson back to her parents' house and Katelyn went with her family to the Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) Emergency Department.

Katelyn was eventually diagnosed with schizoaffective disorder, which is essentially schizophrenia combined with a mood disorder and can include hallucinations, paranoid delusions, and disorganized thoughts. She has spent a total of 10 months in and out of hospital over the last four years, in psychiatric assessment units, or psychiatric intensive care.

"You think it only happens to a certain clientele, but that's not true," shares Katelyn. "It hit me like a ton of bricks."

After her first admission to hospital, Katelyn became a client in the Lynx Early Psychosis Intervention Program, a four-County team with locations in Cobourg through Northumberland Hills Hospital Community Mental

Health Services (NHHCMHS), as well as Campbellford, Peterborough, Lindsay, and Minden. She later transferred to NHH's Assertive Community Treatment Team (ACTT), a multidisciplinary team of registered professionals in the disciplines of psychology, social work, nursing, addictions, occupational therapy, vocational rehabilitation and psychiatry, which covers all of Northumberland County. She credits these services for keeping her out of the hospital.

"The team does my injections to give me my medicine and checks in with me once or twice a week," says Katelyn, explaining they're available to check in as much as she needs.

"Not having to travel and having such easy access to these services is huge. The team surrounds you whether you want them to or not," she says, laughing.

Recovery is not a simple process; it is something she takes on in every aspect of her life. With the support of NHHCMHS, she celebrated one full year out of hospital in May 2019 and is now celebrating a year and a half.

Today, Katelyn is a true advocate for mental health and mental illness awareness. She shares her story at trainings



and program's like NHH's The World of Mental Health, at Crisis Intervention Training organized for social service providers across the County by the OPP, and at paramedic special training. She also wrote a book, Within the Norm, an autobiographical guide to living with mental illness. By sharing her story, she hopes to change the fear and misunderstanding of mental illness - to help others share their stories and to change the perception of what mental illness looks like.

The care and services provided by NHHCMHS help people like Katelyn, who suffers from a mental illness, but is so much more: a daughter, a sister, a mother, a wife, a teacher, an author, and an athlete.

very year, NHH Foundation Gala guests slip into their dresses, tie their ties, and perfect their hairdos for an evening filled with laughter, fun, and a lot of generosity. For most, this day-of preparation is as much as it takes to celebrate the evening in style, but this isn't the case for those coordinating the event.

This year, in contrast to the masquerade theme, it's time to remove the mask from the event – to offer an exclusive behind the scenes look at what is entailed in pulling off such a spectacular evening, and to shine a light on the team who work tirelessly to do so.

Though the Gala itself is only one evening, the planning starts months in advance and relies on the dedication and hard work of a Gala Cabinet and volunteers, in addition to staff time. The Cabinet is the core planning group, led by the Cabinet Chair and made up of Chairs with portfolios covering: Food and Beverage, Silent Auction, Décor, Volunteer, Doctors' Raffle, and Sponsorship, as well as Foundation Board Representatives and Members at Large.

The Cabinet narrows down the theme early in the

calendar year and from here, things start rolling: décor is planned, sponsorship letters are sent, menus are tasted, auction items are requested, and more. Monthly Cabinet meetings are held to ensure every detail is finalized, every task is assigned, and every to-do is checked off the list.

The hard work of the Cabinet throughout the year is instrumental to the success of the event. It is their efforts that ensure the evening goes off without a hitch and that allow most attendees to worry about nothing more than their own day-of preparation – confident the evening ahead of them will run smoothly and provide a chance to celebrate with both old and new friends. The Cabinet is structured in a way to allow membership and support to be retained year after year, while also allowing space for new members and encouraging fresh perspectives.

In other communities, an event this large entails hired contractors and companies to execute a silent auction, decorate the venue, and secure sponsorships. NHH Foundation feels lucky to have such dedicated volunteers, who not only raise their hand to take on a

role, but once theirs, own it and run with it. It is clear these volunteers take pride in the event; and it is clear when you see the smiling faces of guests, witness the surprise at the grandeur of the event, and hear of the incredible funds raised; this pride is well earned.

In addition to the core Cabinet team, the event could not be made possible without other volunteers who set up in advance, help on the night of, and tear down after. The venue is filled with Gala volunteers for a good three days before the event, doing everything from cleaning, to blowing up balloons, hanging décor, moving furniture, setting up the silent auction, assembling decorations, and setting tables. On the night of, volunteers can be found performing tasks like checking coats at the door, running the silent auction, assisting in the photo area, and selling raffle tickets. Finally, the day after the event, the venue fills with volunteers once again to tear down and pack up decorations, move furniture, and clean up after the evening's festivities.

For most guests, once the clothing is laundered, bobby pins removed from the hair, and feet recovered from

sense of mystery floated in the air on Saturday, November 2nd as the Cobourg Lions' Centre filled with glamorously masked figures, gathered for Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) Foundation's 19th Annual Gala. Guests began the evening by mingling and catching up during a cocktail reception before sitting down to a delectable four course dinner that included a rich soup perfect for fall, as well as a duo of short ribs and beef tenderloin, and finished with a decadent chocolate mousse cake adorned by a gold-dusted chocolate mask - perfectly in line with the theme.

The grandiose décor took your breath away as you entered the main event space, with oversized balloons filling the ceiling, large twinkling stars hanging over each table, and accents of gold and black tying everything together. No detail was too small to be incorporated - even the cutlery sparkled in gold. and the masks accessorizing the outfits of the quests only enhanced the décor, adding mystery to the evening.

Not disguised in the room was the generosity of those in attendance, each paying \$300 to attend the event, and many bidding on a plethora of impressive silent auction items as well as purchasing raffle tickets.

Following the raffle draws, an inspiring speech was delivered by Katelyn Taylor, a grateful patient of NHH's Community Mental Health Services, who shared her story to demonstrate the importance of mental health services in the community. This led into what was once again the evening's highlight: the Fund Me Auction, which saw donors standing up to pledge an impressive total of \$154,200. As dancers took to the floor previously occupied by these Fund Me donors, there was a feeling of celebration in the room that lasted throughout the night.

"The spirit and support of our community continues to amaze me!" exclaims Rhonda Cunningham. "This evening relies not only on the generosity of our guests and sponsors, but also on the volunteers and staff who work tirelessly to ensure its success - everyone involved gives so much."
