On April 23rd 2018, Pamela Clement, the Site Supervisor of Security at Northumberland Hills Hospital (NHH) was enjoying a day off from work with her family. In her 11 years of walking in the front doors of NHH to report for work, she never imagined she would one day be carried in those same doors on a stretcher by Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

It was right after eating dinner when Pamela began experiencing indigestion. This was common in her everyday life and she didn't think much of it. She took her medication as prescribed but the pain progressed and proceeded to travel to her right shoulder. Feeling nauseous, she called 911.

It was a decision that saved her life. She was on her way to having a heart attack.

Pamela, who is a member of NHH's on-site security team, G4S, experienced the care provided by the skilled staff at NHH for the first time in her life. Immediately upon arrival, "I had a team looking after me and I received full care, including blood and lab services," says Pamela. "I cannot say enough about the wonderful care I received."

She soon learned she was having a heart attack and was in a pre-diabetic state. Pamela, an active and healthy eater recalled, "I wasn't expecting this at all. I was so shocked." Yet from this experience Pamela learned her condition was hereditary and could have happened to her at any time no matter what precautions she took. Thankfully, when it did happen, she was able to rely on NHH to get her back to her regular self in a timely manner. This experience influenced Pamela to change her own life and following the recommendations of her treatment team, she has been able to reverse all of her assessments back to a normal range and has been able to reverse her pre-diabetic state.

After three days in hospital, Pamela was discharged home. "The doctors really explained everything to my husband to make him feel comfortable with my after-care." Pamela, with the help of her medical team and her family, has been able to make a full recovery. Today she continues to walk the halls of NHH with pride, as she fully believes in the services offered.

Your donations help patients like Pamela receive exceptional care when they need it most. "Thank you from the bottom of my heart," Pamela shared. "I never expected to be a patient where I work every day, I am so grateful the staff at NHH saved my life."


Prior to his death in September 2017, Wick spent considerable time as an in-patient at NHH. Margie was a constant companion and caregiver throughout his admissions.

Bill Patchett, a man who needs little to no introduction, will be remembered for the significant contributions and leadership he provided to many local and international organizations. The Northumberland Hills Hospital Foundation was one of the organizations he devoted his time to – his most significant role was in chairing the **Caring for Generations** capital campaign to build the hospital we now call home.

Nine months ago, the Hospital and Foundation were able to recognize and celebrate Bill with the unveiling of Bill's Garden at Northumberland Hills Hospital.

Located on the main floor, the art installation is comprised of individual painted floral tiles, mounted on an acrylic backdrop. Each tile can be dedicated for \$1,500 and over time, the garden will grow. Each tile has an individual recognition blade and people have purchased tiles in honour of a happy occasion, to celebrate a life well lived, or to express thanks to their care team at NHH. When the garden was unveiled in September, 2018, there were 16 art tiles and now there are 48 tiles. We truly are growing Bill's garden and nurturing the legacy he worked so hard to help create.

While we will miss Bill greatly, we will continue to be inspired by the many lessons he taught us over the years.
