- Post-Acute Specialty Services Restorative Care, Inpatient Rehabilitation, Palliative Care

Community support is critical to a hospital's success – and this is why we need your help.



- Redevelop the Medical Device Reprocessing Department (MDRD)
- Replace and renew critical medical equipment (i.e. surgical scopes, hospital beds, IV poles, and more)

#### Redevelopment of Pharmacy

Renovations to this space will provide upgrades to meet current bestpractice standards and benefits include:

- · Streamlined workflow
- · More timely drug administration for patients

- · Increased professional development opportunities and the expansion of team's collective knowledge


#### Replacement of Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) and **Computed Tomography (CT) Scanners**

Diagnostic imaging is critical in diagnosing, screening, and monitoring a majority of illnesses and injuries. The speed and efficiency of this department is instrumental in setting patients on the best course of care. With your support, we will replace our existing MRI and CT to support our frontline diagnostic imaging team in meeting increasing needs and better caring for our community. These newer generation models will:

- · Allow for scans to be conducted faster, meaning a reduction in wait times for patients and increased patient comfort with shorter scan times
- Improve image quality and image at a higher resolution to provide better visualization
- Reduce the level of radiation exposure for patients requiring CT scans
- · Increase comfort for patients requiring MRI scans due to a larger diameter of the opening, resulting in less concerns for anyone experiencing claustrophobia

#### **Optimization of New Clinical Information System**

In today's healthcare climate, interconnectivity and efficient partnerships between care providers are critical for improving the patient/family experience and health outcomes. The new Clinical Information System, implemented during the early phase of the campaign, was a joint undertaking with 11 area hospital sites and links us to these as well as all others using the EPIC CIS. This was a critical first step in establishing a base on which our community can build into the future to stay on top of technological developments, improve the health prospects for all individuals across the region, and seamlessly connect to those both within and outside of our organization.









**to PREPARE FOR GROWTH** 

With the influx of people moving here, as well as our aging population, we see a complex range of health needs facing our community. Your support will help us face our future and prepare for growth by supporting the following projects:

#### **Expansion of Surgical Services with a 4th Operating Room**

Building and equipping a fourth operating room will increase our local and regional surgical capacity, allow for some decrease in surgical wait times, help to attract and retain a talented team, and create the opportunity to explore bringing new surgical services to the area. The fourth operating room will be designed to integrate surgical lights and video equipment using ceiling mounted booms to optimize patient safety and incorporate best practice standards. This will be the second operating room at NHH with these features.

#### Creation of Integrated Stroke Unit

The creation of a 6-bed Integrated Stroke Unit will help to minimize the time between a patient experiencing a stroke and beginning rehab – something that has been shown to result in better patient outcomes. This new unit will provide both acute and rehabilitation care close to home for stroke patients in one location, reducing the need to transfer between units for care, and ensuring patients are surrounded by those with expertise specific to their needs. This will support consistency of care throughout the patient journey.

Centralization and Expansion of Intensive Care Unit (ICU)

The ICU offers the highest level of care to some of our most vulnerable patients. With community support, we will expand our ICU capacity from the current 6 beds to at least 10. The centralization of this unit will help to address human resource challenges and allow for more collaborative care to be delivered to patients. Improvements to this space include both renovation and equipment costs, and the completion of this project will provide an opportunity to expand the scope of critical care to offer a greater level of services locally, reducing the need for families and friends to travel to visit loved ones during already stressful times.

#### **EDEN'S STORY**

It had started as a perfect December day. Eden and Jay Campbell had taken their two boys, Darce, who was two and a half at the time, and Olson, just four months old, to see Santa that afternoon. Once they had the boys down for the night, Eden set out for a little last-minute Christmas shopping while Jay set about wrapping presents. They had no way of knowing when Eden left the house just how much their world would change before their kids woke the next morning.

On her drive from Port Hope to Cobourg, Eden was struck by another vehicle in a head-on collision that totalled her car and required her to be rushed to NHH for emergency care.

Having grown up in Port Hope, she was familiar with NHH; this was the hospital where she was cared for as a child with a broken elbow, where she had visited loved ones, and where she had safely delivered both of her sons. On this December night, she experienced NHH through a different lens, during the scariest and most vulnerable time in her life.

"I was terrified and in shock," shares Eden. "As a nursing mother, I was extremely anxious to get home before Olson woke up for his nighttime feed. I remember the doctor sitting down on the edge of my bed to explain everything to me, and how much my nurse helped put me at ease. The whole team really took the time to listen to me and answer not only my questions, but my husband's and my parents'. Even though I was a stranger to those caring for me, they never made me feel that way - I was treated with so much compassion; really how anyone would want their loved one to be treated."



She was grateful for their help that night; for their kindness and understanding. It's the moments beyond just treating her injuries that really stand out: moments like the doctor's reassuring tone as he sat beside her, the extra care shown to make sure she could operate crutches and get around with her injuries, and, as simple as it seems, a compliment of her earrings that provided a moment of reprieve from the scary situation she was in. The actions of those who cared for her that night made her as comfortable as she could be in those circumstances.

"You never know what could happen to you or a loved one in the blink of an eye," explains Eden when asked why she feels it's important to have quality care in our community. "Knowing there is quality healthcare so close to home with compassionate staff who are not only ready to help, but who really care makes a world of difference."

As our hospital's volumes increase, so too do our needs for Medical Device Reprocessing. The MDRD team is responsible for the decontamination, inspection, packaging, sterilization, and transportation of re-useable medical devices throughout the hospital. Redevelopment of this space will improve both workflow and productivity, and enhance patient and staff safety. Upgrading reprocessing and sterilization equipment with newer and more efficient technology will increase the capacity to meet the higher reprocessing demands of a growing department.

#### Replacement and Renewal of Essential Medical Equipment

Every year, NHH Foundation invests in priority medical equipment and technology and these ongoing needs will continue to be a priority throughout the campaign. With continuous investment, we can support emerging capital priorities necessary to meet the rising demand and manage the increasing complexity of our community's health.
